

ANNOUNCEMENT

AVAILABLE TRAFFIC RIGHTS

FOR MOLDOVA

The Department of Civil Aviation as the Competent Authority based on the Decision of the Minister of Communications and Works for the allocation of Scarce Traffic Rights with Third Countries, Statutory Instrument Act 406/2008, (Official Gazette of the Republic of Cyprus, Supplement III (I), No. 4312, dated 07/11/2008), and which was republished in the Official Journal of the EU (C56/37 dated 10.3.2009), informs European airlines (including air carriers of EEA countries) that, based on the provisions of the Common Aviation Area Agreement between the European Union and its Member States, of the one part, and the Republic of Moldova, of the other part, there are available traffic rights, without restrictions as to the number of airlines, weekly frequencies and capacity on the following route:

Any point in the European Union – intermediate points in the territories of European Neighbourhood Policy partners (1*), ECAA countries (2*), or EFTA countries – Any point in the Republic of Moldova - points beyond

The airlines that are interested in operating the routes should submit their interest to the Department of Civil Aviation at the following address:

Note: The designated airlines will be entitled to 5th freedom traffic rights according to the provisions of the Agreement and subject to the decision of the Joint Committee.

*1 'European Neighbourhood Policy partners' shall here be understood as Algeria, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Egypt, Georgia, Israel, Jordan, Lebanon, Libya, Morocco, Occupied Palestinian Territory, Syria, Tunisia and Ukraine i.e. shall here not include the Republic of Moldova.

*2 ECAA countries' are the countries which are parties to the Multilateral Agreement establishing a European Common Aviation Area which at the date of signature of the agreement were: Member States of the European Union, the Republic of Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Republic of Croatia, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, the Republic of Iceland, the Republic of Montenegro, the Kingdom of Norway, the Republic of Serbia and Kosovo under UN Security Council Resolution 1244.

*3 "EFTA Countries": Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland.
