Medical examination at an Aeromedical Centre

For initial EASA Class 1 and initial EU Class 3 medical certificates the applicant must contact an Aeromedical Centre in order to undergo a medical examination. Aeromedical Centers are specially approved medical facilities authorized to issue medical certificates for pilots and ATC.

If the applicant wears glasses or contact lenses, he/she must bring his/her most recent optician's prescription along to the examination. The AeMC will be able to help with any additional individual preparations he/she need to make before his/her appointment.

At the examination the applicant will need to complete the medical certificate application form. This is a signed declaration containing the following:

- Facts about his/her medical history
- Whether he/she has had a medical examination before, by whom and the result
- Whether he/she has ever been assessed as unfit or had a medical certificate suspended or revoked.

The examination will include the following:

- Medical history
- Physical examination
- Eyesight and ophthalmological exam
- ENT exam and audiogram
- Electrocardiogram (ECG)
- Lung function test
- Hemoglobin blood test
- Urine test

A medical certificate can be issued on the same day as the examination if all the standards are met.

However, if the required standards are not met, or further investigations are necessary before a decision on medical certification is possible, then issue of the certificate may take longer.
